

"LITTLE BUSY BEE" MEN IN CONFERENCE

Dr. S. B. Fracker of American Honey League Will Meet With Oregon Producers Nov. 17.

Oregon beekeepers have obtained the services of Dr. S. B. Fracker, secretary of the American Honey Producers' league and state entomologist of Wisconsin, for their next annual conference at Portland, on November 17-18.

The program under auspices of the Oregon Beekeepers association and the state college extension service, includes other numbers as follows:

Welcome by George L. Baker, mayor of Portland, president's address, K. D. Baker, Goble, co-operative marketing of honey, R. S. Hesse, marketing a specialist extension service, Boys' and Girls' club work with bees, H. C. Seymour, club leader, Wintering bees, J. Christensen, Bush Prairie, Wn.; exhibits, Herman Ahlers, Knappa; fundamentals in apiary management, H. A. Seultgen, secretary of association and extension specialist.

Business meeting and election of officers will be held Saturday, followed by a short concluding program.

Disease control, J. E. Miller, Scappoose; report of legislative committee, A. J. Sandford, Redmond; Queen management, E. H. Bauer, Portland. Room will be provided for display of special apparatus. The conference will be held in the Chamber of Commerce building.

All interested are invited to attend this meeting, which follows "Busy Week" as proclaimed by Governor Ben Olcott.

FARM POINTERS.

J. Skovbo, beekeeper of Hermiston, Oregon, has recently shipped six tons of honey direct to his brother in Copenhagen, Denmark. Skovbo produced a total of thirty tons of honey this year, duplicating his production of honey for each of the last three years.

A good colony of bees at the beginning of the main honey flow should consist of one selected queen and 75,000 to 100,000 workers. There should be as few drones as possible.

One-half of the plant food contained in barnyard manure in the Willamette valley is washed out if it is not protected from the rain. Wherever possible protect the manure pile by some kind of roof, or where this is impossible construct the manure pile with fairly perpendicular walls so that the rain falling on it goes to the center of the pile and is absorbed.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

For sewing on buttons, left over ends of crochet cotton are better than ordinary cotton. It is smoother and stronger.

The full strength and flavor of coffee is obtained when the grounds are crushed as fine as granulated sugar.

After the dust has been beaten out of the carpets, scatter cornmeal over them and then sweep off. The meal and salt brightens carpets beautifully.
