Portland-Northwestern Electric company to make \$900,000 improvements and additions. Astoria lets \$169,128 contract for new hotel. Gresham cannery receiving improvements. Hood River creamery erecting a \$9,000 building. Eugene to let paving contracts. Prune drier capacity in Umpqua valley practically doubled during the past year. Toledo-Pacific Spruce company reconstructing government spruce camp—installing modern machinery and will cut 1,250,000 feet timber. Seaside—High school to get \$3,600 gymnasium. Medford to build \$35,000 reservoir. Wallowa—Work being rushed on Nibley-Minnaugh logging railroad. Coquille to get new \$80,000 hotel. Grading of Echo-Butter Creek highway completed. Huntington—Bay Horse mine enlarging crew. Eugene—Goshen-Lowell road surveyed. Seaside to get 2-story brick building. Corvallis—\$100,000 movie house is completed. Salem crew 48,000 pounds of walnuts on shade trees this year. Cottage Grove—Another business block to rise. Willamina—Oregon Face Brick Co. turning out 30,000 brick daily.
