Congress meets in its fifty-second session next Monday and the all-absorbing topic of the day is who will be elected speaker of the house of representatives. The democrats have a large majority in the house, consequently a successor to Mr. Reed will be elected immediately after the assembling Free Trade Mills, of Texas and Representative Crisp seem, so far, to be in the lead for this high position, while Representative Springer of Illinois, Holman of Indiana, and Hatch of Missouri, are making a still hunt, and in the event of an eruption between the Mills-Crisp factions, some one of the still-hunters may capture the coveted prize. Mills, no doubt, is the most able of the five, but the odds seem to be in favor of Crisp.

News in the history of Oregon has the property valuation increased so much in one year as it has the past one. Indications of prosperity are apparent in every county of the state, in spite of the great cry of hard times. The increase in Columbia county is \$85,684. There has been filed in the office of the secretary of state the assessment rolls from eighteen counties, not including Multnomah—aggregating \$50,237,273. There are still thirteen counties to report yet including some of the largest counties of the state—Yamhill, Tillamook, Sherman, Polk, Morrow, Lane, Klamath, Douglas, Coos, Clatsop, Benton, Baker, and Multnomah, which will probably run the wealth up to \$150,000,000 more. The increase in each county is not very large, but significant; and shows that the prosperity of this great state is not confined to any particular section, but on the contrary, universal.

Under the new "Australian" election law, each county in the state is obliged to provide booths for the voters next June, in which to make up their tickets quietly and secretly, says the Evening Telegram. This fact has led to the bombardment of all the county authorities of the state, for several months past, by the Eastern agents, offering to furnish steel and canvas booths at about three or four times their value. The price fixed by them is from \$8 to \$10 a booth, but they can be made at home for at least one-half that amount. County officials should be careful not to give some outsider twice or three times what the work is worth, when they can get it done at home just as well, and for half the price demanded by these agents. Wooden booths are just as good for the present as those of steel, and will last many years. If a county can procure better and, on the whole, cheaper booths by going East for them, all right; but the fact seems to be that the Eastern agents are asking about two or three times for what they have to sell.

Before the United States supreme court this week the constitutionality of the McKinley law is being tested. The cases being argued are those of Marshall Field & Co., Chicago; Charles Sternbach, et al., Boyd, Sutton & Co., Herman Sternbach & Co., New York, against the customs collectors at Chicago and New York and the United States, to recover money paid these collectors as duty on imports under the McKinley law. The questions raised in these cases is that the tariff was never constitutionally enacted, because the bill signed by the president was not the same bill which passed both houses of congress, the change being due to the omission of the tobacco rebate section when passed by the senate; also that the sugar bounty, provisions of the act were unconstitutional because congress had no power, under the constitution, to create or award such bounties, because the tax was not levied for public purposes; and the reciprocity section of the law is claimed to be unconstitutional because it was a delegation to the president of power belonging only to the legislative body. The arguments in these cases were concluded and submitted to the supreme court Tuesday.

MURDER AND SUICIDE.

J. H. Stine Murdered in Cold Blood.

The Victim Was, Until Recently, Editor of "The Mist."

McMinnville, Or., Nov. 30.—J. H. Stine, editor and proprietor of the Whiteson Advance, was shot and killed near Whiteson, yesterday, by Henry C. Cook, a section boss of the narrow gauge railroad. They had been to Amity to spend Sunday, and were returning after having bought a bottle of brandy at the drug store. They were walking along the railroad track near Whiteson, Stine walking in front and Cook and a German section hand in the rear. Stine had been talking about his paper, when Cook pulled out a new pistol and fired at Stine, shooting him in the neck. The German became frightened and started to run, when he heard a second shot. He supposed it was fired at him, which caused him to run faster, and he did not stop until he got to Whiteson. A crowd was gathered which returned and found both men dead. The men were good friends and had not been quarreling. They were both Grand Army members, Cook being a member of Company A, Thirty-fifth, New Jersey infantry, and Stine of the Pennsylvania reserves. Stine is well known to the newspaper fraternity throughout the state, having been connected with papers at Independence, Grant's Pass, St. Helens and many other places. He was a good country editor with poor business ability. He leaves a wife and one child, who now live at Whiteson.

Additional particulars of the tragedy: that Stine was shot because he had been in the habit of joking Cook about the stories told concerning Cook and a characterless woman of the neighborhood, stating that the Grand Army would get hold of the story and put him in the penitentiary. Cook was mentally weak and totally destitute of understanding a joke. He had a fitful previous one of his men about the story the previous week, in which he got worse. He had been drinking during the past month.

The following notated Whiteson, November 29, and addressed to Mrs. M. Garvin, found under his pillow, shows that his own death was premeditated, but the shooting of Stine cannot be accounted for:

I leave all my personal effects, money, etc. to you. Good bye, and God bless you. I leave you everything in the section-house, bed, stove, pipe and matting on the floor, trunk and effects, one pair of blankets, three quilts, mattress, one pillow and a bedstead. Good bye again. There is also \$27 in my pocket besides my month's pay in my car. See me neatly buried. I am your friend and do not mourn me as I am of no use.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

(From Our Regular Correspondent.)

Secretary Blaine and Governor-elect McKinley, walking arm in arm up the state department steps was about as practical a refutation of the stories so assiduously circulated by democrats, of their not being on good terms as it would be possible to find. Neither of the men are the sort who pretend to like a man whom they dislike; therefore the fact that they are, and have always been, the very best of personal friends is plain to all, except those who refuse to see.

The president has devoted considerable time to world's fair matters this week. He has heard the views of President Palmer on the necessity of that additional \$5,000,000 appropriation by congress; also the report of the board of control, and a verbal statement from Mrs. Potter Palmer, president of the board of body managers. The whole question is so important that the president has decided not to incorporate it in his annual message to congress, but to prepare a special world's fair message to be sent in after congress gets down to work. It is understood that the president has promised to urge congress to make the appropriation asked for by the board of control and there is little doubt that the appropriation will eventually be made, although it is probable that some of the new "two-for-five" members may oppose it.

The action of the national committee in selecting Minneapolis for the next national convention, and June 7, for the time of its meeting, appears to give general satisfaction to republicans who were not prejudiced in favor of some other city. It was certain as soon as the committee got together that the convention would go to the West, and had Omaha been able to make a better showing in the way of hotel accommodations it might have been the winner, although the Minnesota people would have been hard to beat, on account of the good showing they made from the start.

Invitations have been sent to the president, his cabinet and prominent members of congress to witness the launching, at Philadelphia, on December 2, of the armored battle ship, New York, which is, in many respects, the most notable vessel yet constructed for our navy. She will be the heaviest ship ever launched in America, and is expected to be a very formidable fighting craft.

The speakership game has reached the stage that makes the playing of trump cards necessary. The first of these was played more than a week ago when it was announced that Tammany hall had declared for Crisp and was working to secure him the entire New York delegation. This was met by the announcement made by Mr. Bryan of his withdrawal in favor of Mills, and later the Mills men took another trick by announcing that the New England delegations had decided to vote solely for Mills. The rest of the candidates are holding back their strong cards to the last, and it will not be surprising if one or two of them make an attempt, later on, to throw the game to Mills or Crisp. The Mills people claim to have ninety votes pledged and Crisp's friends claim that he has 114, but the most liberal of his opponents will not concede him over eighty-three. The president heard a delegation representing the anti-monopoly league, the Working Woman's Protective League, the Independent Labor party and the New York Silver League, this week, in favor of his recommending to congress the appointment of a labor commissioner to consider and report upon remedies for evils that exist in the industrial system of the country.
