Following is the report of the State Weather Bureau for the week ending on Monday, July 18.

Weather—Showers occurred on the 3rd, 4th and 5th of July, being heaviest on the 4th; the total rainfall was from 0.10 to 0.25 of an inch.

The temperature was from 61 to 82 degrees, the minimum ranged from 62 to 80 degrees, the maximum from 62 to 82 degrees.

The weather was cloudy to partly cloudy and cool up to Sunday, Sunday and Monday were clear and warm.

Crops—The weather was exceedingly favorable to the growth of vegetation. Precipitation was light, and the soil was not saturated.

The fruit prospects continue to be of the most encouraging character. The rain on the 4th did not do much harm to the fruit, but the damage was slight.

Hay is getting on well and will soon be ready to cut. By the 15th fall sown wheat will begin to be harvested in the northern counties.

The encouraging reports as to the wheat, barley and oat crops, as well as the immediate coast vegetation, were never better; the hay crop is especially heavy, and potatoes promise a heavy crop.
