WHERE OREGON STANDS.

The result of the Oregon election furnishes food for much reflection, and the more one studies the situation the more thoroughly he must become convinced that the tariff was not the object upon which the people of this state had their minds fixed this year.

Leaving this question, let us look at the vote in the first district. Out of a total vote of 47,073, Tongue, the gold standard candidate received 19,355 votes, or 3862 less than that cast for the opposition.

ELLIS, though handicapped by an independent republican in this congressional district, is elected by a plurality of 441 votes, and will again represent the people of his district in congress for two years more.

THE hotels and boarding houses of St. Louis have refused to admit colored delegates who are in attendance at the republican national convention, presumably because of color, but the claim is made that the hotel accommodations are all engaged.

THE republican national convention meets in St. Louis next Tuesday, June 16th. At this time everything points to McKinley's nomination on the first ballot.

Fellow soldiers, comrades of the John Bucher Post, and Christian friends: In an effort to obey and comply with the request of our esteemed post commander, Mr. Spencer, and with a consciousness of incompetency to do justice on so important an occasion, I now appear before you.

Not only is Mary's sacrifice and devotion approved for we here are furnished a divine example for commemorating, perpetuating to all time the memory of the heroism of loving hearts expressed by actions of self abandonment for the good of others.
