INDIANA'S EARLY GOVERNMENT

Relics of the First Capital and Constitutional Kim Still Standing.

At Corydon, the first capital of Indiana, are the relics still standing of the first government of the State. One is the old State house, built in 1811 for the Territorial Legislature and offices. The building was not completed until 1815. The State was admitted into the Union in 1816 and the State officials used the building until 1825. The building is still a solid structure.

The second relic is the constitutional elm. The constitutional convention met at the State house in June, 1816,
