TRUSTS AND POLITICAL RECORDS.

The immense combinations of wealth which are being effected almost daily in this country is subject matter for much discussion, being made particularly a question of politics. Regarding the extent of the bearing the policy of any political party has had or now has, the St. Louis Globe-Democrat, one of the foremost journals of the nation, has the following concise statement:

"It is the republican party, not the democratic, that has legislated nationally against trusts. A democratic congress never originated any anti-trust law, but a law of this nature has been greatly weakened by democratic votes. Thus stands the official congress. Republican administrations have acted in restraint of trusts. Democratic administrations have either done nothing or undermined the republican statute passed for trust restriction.

for the improvement of roads. The truth must be acknowledged that unless we pay for roads we will never get them, and a small tax for that purpose would be no direct burden upon the people, in fact the public will soon demand such a course. Heretofore it has been beyond the power of the court to carry out this plan, which has long been in view, for reasons well known, but time will provide, and good roads will result at such small cost that no burden will be felt. A one-mill tax will raise \$1300 or \$1400 each year, which if judiciously expended, would prove a mighty factor in the improvement of roads. There is no good reason now to question the assumption that in a brief period the court can levy a two-mill tax for such a purpose and the rate of taxation still be lower than that now prevailing.
