MAN DROWNED.

Lambert Christensen Falls into the Columbia River last Thursday. Following is the verdict rendered by the jury selected by coroner C. E. Dalton, to inquire into the death of the man drowned in the Columbia river last Thursday night. We, the coroner's jury being truly sworn and empaneled at St. Helens Oregon the 20th day of Sept., 1902, to render a verdict as to the cause of death of deceased, find that the deceased name was Lambert Christensen, age about 20 years, native of Denmark. He came to his death by accidentally stepping off of the scow of the dredge of the Port of Portland in the Columbia river at 11:45 P. M. the 18th, inst., and was drowned. No blame can be attached to anyone on dredge. Everything being done to rescue him.

The County's Wealth

The assessor completed the assessment roll for 1902 Tuesday evening, and the summary shows a most satisfactory condition and increase in the assessable wealth of the county, as follows: No. of acres tillable land 10,954. Value \$170,225. No. acres of non tillable land 370,800. Value \$921,800. Improvements on deeded land, value 34,640. No. of town lots 5,020 value 39,630. Value of improvements on town lots 40,325. Value of improvements on land not deeded or patented 13,855. No. miles rail road bed 52,201 value 100,000. No. miles logging road bed 10 value 6,000. Value of logging rail road stock 29,730. No. miles of telegraph and telephone lines 101 value 11,210. Value of steam boats, sail boats, stationary engines, man's machinery 70,940. Value of merchandise and stock in trade 22,110. Farming implements, wagons and carriages etc. 6,325. Notes and accounts 17,730. No. shares of stock 183. Value 1,100. Household furniture, watches etc. Value 22,872. No. horses and mules 1613 value 24,141. No. cattle 5,832 value 100,509. Sheep and goats 1910 value 1910. No. swine 990 value 1,791. Gross value of all property 1,718,638. Exemptions 120,798. The total increase amounts to about \$70,000 over last year, putting the wealth of the county at over a million and a half dollars.
