Is It Kenowski's Ghost or Somebody Else?

Tales of haunted houses comes from the vicinity of Bunker Hill, although a number of people, who have heard the uncanny noises are inclined to credit them to natural causes.

Not a great many weeks ago strange noises were heard in the Schieve dwelling and more than one person heard the strange sounds, which were not satisfactorily accounted for.

Mr. Wilson, who lived in the house for a time, says that he believed the noises were caused by rats or some animal under the building.

Strange noises also have been heard in the building, formerly occupied by A. Kenowski. Raps and other sounds have been heard in the building, so it is reported.

August Schieve, who was hanged in St. Helens one year ago last July for murder, is buried near the old Schieve house. Some persons express the opinion that Kenowski was murdered in the vicinity of his home, after escaping from the custody of Sheriff Mattan Kenowski.

Whether he sank into the rocky earth at this location, fell into a slough and drowned or was subsequently murdered, is something that was never determined after a vigilant search by the sheriff. Kenowski's place was sold for delinquent taxes, but no news has ever been received of his whereabouts. However, his ghost is as likely to show in St. Helens some of these stormy, windy nights as at Bunker Hill or any other place.
