AT IT AGAIN.

Mr. R. H. Mitchell, in the Houlton Register, recently under the statement that the editor of the Mist furnished the Oregonian its information in regard to Representative Mayger's eloquence. In order that the people of Columbia County may more fully than at present realize how utterly untrustworthy Mr. Mitchell is when he is endeavoring to injure an opponent we reproduce the following from the managing editor of the Oregonian:

Portland, Or., Oct. 27, 1905. Mr. E. H. Flagg, St. Helens, Or. Dear Sir: I have noticed in one or two Columbia County papers a statement that a recent article in this paper relative to the eloquence of Representative Mayger had come from you. I suppose that it makes no great difference to you, but I understand how troublesome these neighborhood matters may sometimes be. I therefore desire to say to you that the information the Oregonian received about the eloquence came from other sources and that you had nothing to do with it, directly or indirectly. On the contrary, in our search for information the City Editor called you up at St. Helens and you told him you knew nothing about it.

We are sorry to refer again to this matter; but Mr. Mitchell compels it. He has adopted the role of agitator and has charged decent people with crimes which, if proven, should send them to the penitentiary, and, when called before the Grand Jury to assist in investigating these matters, he has utterly failed to "make good." The truth is that Mr. Mitchell furnished the Mayger story to the Oregonian and then had the nerve to deny it and attempt to saddle it upon the editor of the Mist, who is the Oregonian's regular correspondent and generally responsible for whatever appears in that paper from this county.

THE BOSTON LADIES AND EQUAL SUFFRAGE.

The Massachusetts Association opposed to the extension of Woman Suffrage is sending its documents to every country editor in Oregon, in the hope of defeating the passage of the pending amendment to the Oregon constitution giving the women of Oregon the ballot. If these women do not think the Massachusetts women are capable of intelligently exercising the full rights of citizenship we have no objection to their saying so, but that is no reason why the intelligent women of Oregon should be denied this privilege. Locally there may be some ground for their objection, as Massachusetts has a larger per centage of illiteracy than any of the Pacific Coast states, and even the women of the Association, while they are probably educated in certain lines, show remarkably poor reasoning powers. Says the pamphlet before us: "If the great mass of ignorant women's votes are to be added to the great mass of ignorant men's votes, there will be constant unwise demands for work, money, bread, insurance, etc." In Massachusetts this sort of logic may be all right. There may be in that state a "great mass" of ignorant women. They may predominate, and it may be necessary for their own good that they be guided and controlled by the cultured ladies who constitute the society with the long name. Out here in Oregon it is different. There are very few women whose lack of education or intelligence prohibits them from the suffrage, and this sort of an argument will have no influence whatever with the men of Oregon. This is very distinctly an American state. Its pioneers were men of far more than average ability, and it is the well educated sons and daughters of these pioneers who are now asking for woman the full exercise of the franchise. We assure the Boston ladies that they will add a "mass of intelligence" to the body politic, and as they lay all the bread they need their first demand will probably be for pie, and no true Bostonian would deny them that necessity of life.
