Frank Deganda was a Clatskanie visitor on Wednesday.

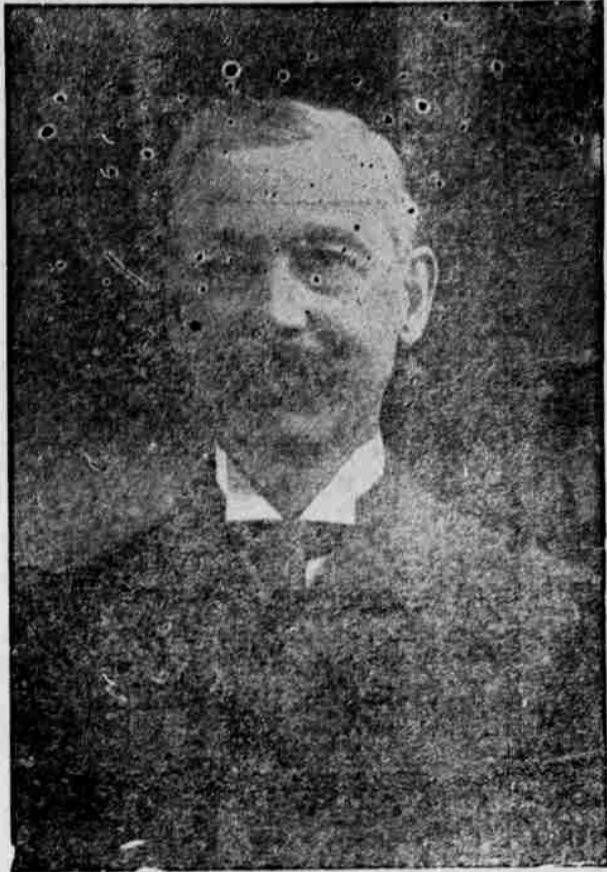
Tona Whitebeck, of Winlock, Wash., is visiting his mother, Mrs. T. C. Watts, this week.
