BIG TIMBER DEAL

10,000 Acres Year Goble Sold For \$800,000. What is said to be the biggest deal in Columbia River timber lands ever made was completed Monday, when the Clark & Wilson Lumber Company purchased 10,000 acres near Goble for \$800,000.

The logging outfit formerly worked on the tract has been putting about 100,000 feet of logs into the river daily. The purchasers announce that the capacity will be increased, making the daily cut about 150,000 feet.

The Clark & Wilson Lumber Company is made up of O. M. and W. W. Clark and C. G. and J. A. Wilson. The Clarks are Wisconsin lumbermen and lived neighbors to William Reid in that State.
