SIGN THE PETITION

At the meeting of the Columbia County Development League at the Circuit Court room in St. Helens on Friday last it was decided to circulate petitions for the signatures of taxpayers, requesting the county court to appropriate \$1,000 for advertising the resources of Columbia County in accordance with the proposition of the Sunset Magazine. In order that all may understand what this means the Mist will explain the matter as clearly as possible:

The Sunset Magazine is owned and published by the Harriman railroad system, and its object is to advertise the resources of the Pacific Coast, in order that immigration may be brought here and the country which the Harriman lines traverse build up. It is not the printing or publishing business direct profit and no printer or publisher could afford to do the work it proposed to do for Columbia County, nor, in fact, could the same amount of good advertising and publicity be secured by this county in any other way, for its artists, writers and distributors are employed at good salaries and are constantly at work, and every facility of the great corporation will be placed at our disposal to make the work effective. It is proposed:

1st. To carry a half page advertisement for two months in the Sunset Magazine, which has a circulation of 150,000 copies.

2d. To print 10,000 thoroughly illustrated 32 page pamphlets.

3d. To follow up with 10,000 smaller pamphlets on "How to get to Columbia County, Oregon."

4th. To furnish an unlimited number of folders on "Colonist Rates to Columbia County, Oregon."

4th. To have an illustrated "writeup, independent of the advertisement in Sunset."

6th. To advertise Columbia County, Oregon in the Harriman Magazine published in Europe.

7th. To include Columbia County in the illustrated lectures given throughout the Middle and Eastern States this Fall and Winter.

It is also agreed, that whenever a name is furnished direct to the company's passenger agent at Portland a copy of the 32 page pamphlet will be mailed, postage paid, by the company.

The method proposed is the only fair way to raise money for public purposes. The members of the Columbia County Development League are giving their time and several of them have already contributed to its expenses much more than their share. The expense to the taxpayers will be so small that it will not compare with the advantages derived, provided we want to have people come here. It would take but very few accessions to our tax roll to more than compensate the county for the trivial expense incurred and we believe our farmers and business men will sign the petition almost unanimously.
