### A LAST WORD.

The argument is ended and nothing remains for the people of Columbia County, on Tuesday next, but go to the polls and deposit their ballots. This is the banner Republican County of Oregon. The registration shows that there are 1598 Republicans against 299 Democrats, a plurality, in round numbers of 1300. The only question is, Are these Republicans good enough citizens to go to the polls and vote on election day? We believe they are, and that when the votes are counted next Tuesday night, Columbia County will have achieved the proud distinction of giving the Republican nominees for President and Vice President the greatest proportionate majority of any county in Oregon.

If you believe in Republican principles, as administered by Theodore Roosevelt, you certainly should vote for Taft.

If you believe that labor unions should not be permitted to dominate politics you should vote for Taft.

If you favor retaining the tariff on lumber you should vote for Taft.
