Taft is elected and he will have at least 309 votes in electoral college, and possibly 335, as he is about 400 ahead on incomplete count in Missouri. Taft's plurality in Oregon will be about 25,000. In Columbia County it will be very close to 800. Taft carried New York by about 200,000. Governor Hughes was re-elected by 74,000. Johnson was re-elected in Minnesota. Taft carried Ohio by 50,000. Joseph Cannon was re-elected to Congress. The only Northern States carried by Bryan are Colorado, Alaska, Nevada and Oklahoma. Both branches of Congress are safely Republican. Taft has 1,232,000 plurality of the popular vote.

QUICK WORK—It was just thirty-six hours from the time John Birkhead robbed Booth's jewelry store at Clatskanie until he was on his way to the prison farm, to serve a two-years' sentence. The special grand jury was impeached Saturday morning and it brought in a true bill inside of twenty minutes, and fifteen minutes after the grand jury made its report Judge McBride passed sentence, the prisoner having pleaded guilty. It was lucky for Columbia county that court was in session, as otherwise he would have boarded at the county's expense until the January term.
