### DEPEW DON'T LIKE IT

Chauncey Depew, the whited sepulchre that has disgraced the State of New York by misrepresenting it in the United States Senate, does not approve of the Oregon plan of submitting to the electors the candidates for the United States Senate. In a recent address to the Republican "leaders and workers" of the New York 27th Assembly District, he took occasion to denounce it, and to eulogize Senator Fulton, whom he claimed it defeated in the primaries. Senator Fulton may well pray to be saved from his friends. The eulogy of Chauncey Depew is more detrimental to any political aspirant today than would be his censure. In all the United States no man has fallen lower in the estimation of the people. He is a doddering old idiot who should be placed in an asylum for the criminal insane. His public record is one of infamy and his private life such as to make his acquaintanceship a disgrace to a decent woman.

No doubt the "party workers and leaders" whom he addressed heartily agreed with him in his unfavorable opinion of Statement No. 1. There would be fewer of his stripe in the United States Senate if every State in the Union adopted the Oregon idea. The self-constituted "leaders" and "workers" of the old school are always and everywhere opposed to any measure that threatens their control of politics. They have no faith in the wisdom of the people and the people have lost all faith in them. They have absolutely controlled the conventions of the dominant party, and it was the revolt against boss-ruled conventions that placed Chamberlain in the State house. They have themselves to thank for whatever crudity and injustice there may be in the new law, and their protest against what Senator Depew calls the "new idea" in politics will not cause the people to reject it. The law will doubtless be amended, but the "idea" (the strength of the law) will prevent its repeal or emasculation.
