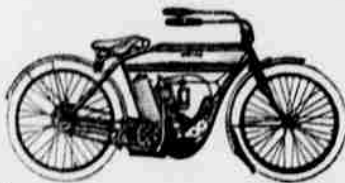

Eakin, of Astoria, to fill the newly created additional judgeship of the Fifth Judicial District, composed of Clatsop, Columbia, Clackamas and Washington Counties, to serve until the first Monday in January, 1911. Mr. Eakin is a brother of Justice Robert Eakin, of the Supreme Court. He was born in Chicago 48 years ago, and came to Oregon in 1866. Later he graduated from the Boston Law School and returned to Astoria, where he has been in practice continually for the past 12 years. He was admitted to the bar in Oregon October 14, 1887.
