Whereas, We realize that under the present conditions the party is losing prestige, politically, which it is rightfully entitled to as the majority party in the State, and that some means should be devised whereby the party should be harmonized in order to secure all the benefits of a majority party in the State;

Whereas, No other method has been suggested for the accomplishment of the much desired end, and that we are in favor of giving this method a trial;

Therefore be it Resolved by the County Central Committee of Columbia County, that Columbia County proceed to select delegates to the State Assembly to be held in the City of Portland on the 21st day of June, 1910, that each precinct in the county elect delegates on such date as may be decided upon at this meeting, and that each precinct committeeman give ten days' notice thereof, and that the number of delegates from each precinct be apportioned by this committee before adjournment.

That each precinct committeeman, after the selection of such delegates, certify the names of such delegates to this committee, and that the committee, through its chairman and secretary, certify the same from all the different precincts to the State Committee and to the State Assembly.

Those favoring the resolution urged that it was not mandatory, and this view was accepted by the members of the committee, nearly every one of whom disclaimed any authority to bind the people of their precinct. Nevertheless the resolution is a clear endorsement of the State Assembly, and does not represent the wishes of the Republican voters of this county.

The committee recommended that precinct meetings to elect delegates to the State Assembly be held on July 9th.

Mr. Martin White introduced the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted: Resolved, That it is the sense of this committee that no assembly be held for Columbia County local matters, but that the committee, in county matters, favor the direct primary without assembly.

The committee then adjourned without date.
