An ordinance entitled an ordinance for the erection of a City Hall in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, adopting plans therefor, providing for the advertising for bids for the construction of the same...

Whereas the City of St. Helens, Oregon, and its inhabitants are without a City Hall and have no place for the storing and safe keeping of its records and corporate property...

Section 1. Now therefore said City, through its Common Council, in pursuance of its charter, is hereby empowered to build upon its said lot, above described, a City Hall...

Section 2. That the Common Council of said City, immediately upon the passing of this Ordinance, employ a competent architect, either by advertising or otherwise, to draw plans and specifications for such a City Hall.

Section 3. That immediately upon the submission of proper and satisfactory plans for such City Hall, said Common Council shall cause the City Recorder of said City to advertise for the period of two weeks...

MR. LAFFERTY'S ANNOUNCEMENT

PORTLAND, Ore., June 27, 1910. To the Republican Voters of the Second Congressional District of the State of Oregon:

In announcing my candidacy for Congress from this district I desire to indicate what I shall stand for if elected. My platform may be briefly outlined as follows:

1—Oregon resources for Oregon people. 2—Liberal treatment toward public land claimants seeking to acquire small tracts for their own use and benefit.

3—Enforcement of the terms of the railroad land grants in Oregon, as to the 2,300,000 acres remaining unsold, and subject to sale under the acts of Congress to actual settlers.

4—Immediate return to Oregon of the \$5,300,000 due this State for irrigation work from the proceeds of the sale of Oregon lands.

5—Every encouragement and protection to honest, competitive business enterprises.

6—Above everything else, just returns to people who work.

7—Amendment of immigration treaties so as to exclude all except Caucasians from coming into this country to compete with our people.

8—Modification of navigation laws with a view to encouraging the building and operation of American merchant ships.

9—Nomination of all candidates for office by the direct primary.

I am prompted to enter the race solely because of my desire to aid the people of the district. Our next representative must vigorously champion the rights of the State upon several important questions, principal among which is that pertaining to the movement for the federal control of western resources, which has been misnamed "conservation."

Settlers within the state are entitled to the bounties provided by Congress as a matter of right and not as a matter of grace. They should not be made to feel that they are either beggars or criminals simply because they seek to acquire 160 acres of government land.

Oregon's magnificent water sites are indestructible, and the more of these sites that are developed the more valuable property in the State will become, and the more comforts we will get out of life. There is more timber in the State than there was fifty years ago, for the reason that fires have been practically stopped and the growth is not interfered with. Private owners are not wasting any timber in Oregon. There is no occasion for establishing a federal guardianship over us.

I favor the direct primary and shall depend entirely for my support upon the action of the Republican voters at the primary, September 24th.
