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

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
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

THE PARIS APACHES.

How They Deal With Their Ca-

lucky Victims. The floods in Paris afforded golden opportunities to the thieves and hooligans-the dreaded "Apaches"-of the French capital. A Paris correspondent sends an interesting account of these reckless men and their methods and weapons.

"The desperate criminals who make a specialty of night attacks are a bloodthirsty, cowardly set of ruffians, and as they are always armed to the teeth and hold human life cheap, a solitary citizen going home late, or a policeman on a lonely beat has very little chance against them.

"When they have once made up their minds to rob a passerby-which one does not matter much-it is more than likely they will decide to begin operations at once. That means that three Apaches will take up a position on the pavement and pretend to be engaged in innocent gossip. The street is deserted. A solitary pedestrian comes into sight. In a moment he is measured up by the three scoundrels on the lookout for their prey. There is not a policman in sight. The moment is favorable.

"'He has a gold chain,' says one. "'He'll do,' says the chief of the criminal trio. 'Get ready.'

"They continue to converse until the stranger reaches them. Involuntarily he glances at them as he passes. That is sufficient.

"'What do you mean by looking at us like that?' asks the chief in an iusolent tone. Then, turning to his companions, he remarks, 'Hasn't he got an ugly mug?"

"The pedestrian, however little he may be inclined to quarrel with the evil-looking ruffians who have accosted him, is unlikely to take their insults in silence. But at his first word of protest one of the group advances on him with a menacing air.

" 'What!' he exclaims, 'I'll show you who you've got to deal with."

"The stranger stands on his guard but immediately another member of the trio bounds upon him from behind seizes him around the neck with his arm and lifts him off the ground. His cries for help are stifled in his throat and if he succeeds in making a sound the arm which presses against his throat is tightened and he loses con sciousness.

"While this is going on another of the accomplices goes through the victim's pockets, while the third keeps watch for the police. Then, when everything worth taking has been appropriated, the wretch who has almost strangled the victim releases his arm, gives him a violent push and sends him headlong to the pavement where he will lie senseless for half as

hour at least. "But things do not always pass so easily. Sometimes the victim shows more resistance than was expected, and then the Apaches have to modify their plans. He must either be stunned with a blow from a mutton-bone or given a stab with a knife or dagger The mutton-bone used by the Paris Apache is a terrible weapon. In ap pearance it resembles a small hatchet without a handle, is about six inches long, and comes from the shoulder of the sheep. This and the knife and the knuckle-iron are the favorite weapons of the Paris hooligan. They are effective and noiseless, whereas the use of the revolver is likely to attract the

police. "Among the more recent methods invented by the Paris Apache for rendering the passing citizen incapable of resistance is the lasso. At the favorable moment a cord from 15 to 29 feet in length and ending in a run ning knot is thrown by an expert almost cut with a fork and is as good hand. As it falls over the victim's heal it is jerked tight, and, half strangled, he is thrown to the ground. The



GREAT LOSS OF LIFE IN JAPAN

Recent Disastrous Floods Cause Death of 1,400.

Starvation Ends Misery of Men Who Had Climbed to Tops of Poles to Escape Drowning.

Victoria, Sept. 6.- More than 1400 lives were lost in the Japanese floods according to official reports received by the Kamabura Maru tovanilla. Roll out checolate cookies day. Among the victims was the family of Mr. Kondo, president of the Nippon Yusen Kaisha, who were drowned when his villa was demolished.

The great floods were followed by heavy storms at sea, in which several Japanese steamers were hadly wrecked. The steamer Hokuriku Maru was lost in Tsuruga Strait, with all hands, on August 13. On the same day the Shingu Maru

went ashore near Atsuta, her com-plement of 130 being saved by revenue steamers. The Kwannon Maru, which was driven into Toba for shelter, had some of her boats rushed by panie-stricken passengers who thought she was about to found founder. The boat crews left the vessel and their fate was uncertain when the Antilochus left. The vessel ultimately reached Yokkaichi in

safety. The big volunteer steamer Ume-The big volunteer steamer Umegaki Maru had a severe struggle with the gale with 308 passengers on board and reached Yokkaichi in distress with her coal exhausted. Several other steamers suffered and several sailing vessels were hadly wrecked, the Eiriki Maru, laden with coal, foundered off Nikijima. Miye Prefecture, her captain and several others being drowned. Two schooners also foundered, a majority of those on board swimming ashore.




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
