THE STATE FAIR.

The editor of The Mist desires to thank all those that aided by their contributions in making Columbia County's exhibit at the State Fair a great success. Included in this number are Caton Brothers, Mr. Brown and Mr. Schneider of Sauvie Island; Mr. Hegele, Asa Holladay and Mr. Miller of Scappoose; Mr. Lloyd of Deer Island, Yankton Grange, Natal and Goble Grange; James McDonald of Clatskanie, and very many others throughout the county. We think it is fair to claim the exhibit was far better than last year, and in point of quality was not excelled by any. In awards it was given fourth premium—below Benton, Douglas and Polk, and above Clackamas and Clatsop. This is as high a position as we could expect to achieve with an appropriation of only \$400. Yet it was the general opinion, quite freely expressed, that Columbia should have been given third place. In variety and quality of fruit shown this county took the lead, showing Gravenstein apples measuring 14 inches in circumference, beautifully colored, sound and clean. They were from Mr. Miller at Scappoose. Mr. Asa Holladay's showing was, as it always is, the best from a commercial standpoint of any in the pavilion. The exhibit made by Yankton Grange was clearly entitled to and will receive the award of \$20 for the best Grange exhibit, as far out-classed in quantity and variety the exhibits from Natal and Goble Granges. Mr. Louis Rosasco, the St. Helens gardener, is entitled to special mention for his liberality. His showing of garden products was a great help, including the biggest cabbages and crook-neck squashes in the pavilion. There were quite a number of visitors from Columbia County, including Messrs. Tarbell of Yankton, Peterson of Mist, Tichenor and Congers of Clatskanie, Lloyd of Deer Island, Charles Muecke, William and Edwin Ross of St. Helens, and as to whether the county was efficiently represented we refer our readers to them.

ST. HELENS SCHOOL NOTES

School opened Monday, September 12, with an enrollment of 149, which is an increase of about 25 per cent over the number present at the opening of school one year ago.

The new furnace is now fully installed and up to date has worked satisfactorily. The stoves have been removed, which adds considerably to the size and appearance of each room.

A number of new seats which were ordered have arrived and been put in place and there are now seats for all.

Two new banners were purchased, and at the end of each month will be placed in the room or rooms having the best attendance and the least number of tardy marks.

There is a study period from 8:30 to 9 o'clock each morning, when all pupils who desire can study without interruption and receive individual instruction. A full code of rules and regulations, etc., for teachers, pupils, and janitor have been adopted.

THE PRIMARY ELECTION.

The primary election is tomorrow and there are a large number of people in this county and throughout Oregon who will not rest until tonight. Saturday, the 24th day of September, is the day they have been looking forward to for some time and, sad as it is to relate, there are doing to be more disappointed than pleased.

The registration in this county has not been as heavy as was to be expected, but there will undoubtedly be a large number of voters. Those who have not registered can still vote in this manner, and so if you have not got your name on the Clerk's books, be sure and vote just the same. Following is the number of voters registered in the fifteen precincts of this county, along with their political affiliations:

St. Helens precinct leads with 288, and Clatskanie has a total registration of 258. Houlton is third with 232, and Rainier is fourth with 155. The St. Helens and Rainier precincts always have been the largest in the county, but Clatskanie will probably poll the largest vote this year, as both the former large precincts have been cut in two. The vote at the general election this year will be far larger than at any election ever held before.
