

Notice of Intention to Apply for Liquor License.

Shipping This Week—On Wednesday last, April the 10th, the steamer Schooner Westerner cleared from this port with a cargo of 600,000 feet of lumber for San Francisco, and today the Yellowstone will leave with about 750,000 feet of ties and lumber. The Westerner is in charge of Captain Bernard Kelly, former master of the Alliance and one of the veterans of Coast shipping. The Schooner came in Thursday morning and will load about 650,000 feet for San Francisco, while the Yellowstone will come in Saturday and take on a partial cargo of lumber, leaving Saturday night with about sixty passengers. The schooner Alvena is taking on a cargo of a little less than a million feet of ties at the boom in the slough.

To Rebuild Steamer Shaver—On Tuesday last after having reached a settlement with the marine insurance company the Shaver Transportation Company began preparation for rebuilding the steamer Shaver whose hull practically was destroyed by fire on the morning of April 27 as she was lying in her berth at the Davis street dock in Portland. An effort will be made to have her ready to resume service in the log-towing trade within the next six weeks or two months. Portions of the pilothouse may be saved, but it will be necessary to build an entirely new hull for the steamer. The gear and all portable material have been removed from the craft, which is lying at the Shaver yards on the east side of the Willamette just below the Burnside street bridge. As yet it has not been determined by the company whether to let a contract for her rebuilding or to have the work done by day labor. It is expected that this matter will be settled definitely soon.
