BE IT REMEMBERED, That a regular term of the County Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Columbia was begun and held at the Court House in the City of St. Helens in said county and state on Wednesday, the third day of May, 1911, the same being the first Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a Regular Term of said Court, when were present:

Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had: Journal read, approved and signed. Matter of petition of H. R. Dibblee et. al. for a county road: On this 3rd day of May, 1911 comes on for hearing the petition of H. R. Dibblee, et. al., freeholders residing in the road district or districts of said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road,—

In districts No. 6 and 8, in and near the city of Rainier—And it appearing to the Court that a Remonstrance containing a greater number of signatures than appear on the petition, has been filed and presented herein. It is ordered by the Court that said petition be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of petition of T. A. Lovelace, et. al. for a county road: On this 3rd day of May, 1911 comes on for hearing the petition of T. A. Lovelace, et. al., freeholders, residing in the road district or districts of said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road, described as follows, to wit:—

Beginning at stake "A" at a point on the county road 32 rods Northwest from the Southeast corner of the Northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 36, Township 7 N., Range 3 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence in a south-westerly direction through Sections 1 and 11 in Township 6 N., Range 3 West W. M. and terminating at stake "B" at the Southwest corner of the Southeast quarter of the above described Section 11, intersecting the county road at that place.

And it appearing to the Court that a remonstrance to said petition containing a greater number of signatures than appear on the petition, has been filed and presented herein. It is ordered by the Court that said petition be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of petition of A. Hangerud, et. al. for a county road: On this 3rd day of May, 1911 comes on for hearing the petition of A. Hangerud et. al. freeholders residing in the road district or districts of the said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road, described as follows:—

Commencing at a stake which is set 90 rods south of the common corner of sections 8, 9, 16 and 17 T. 3 N. R. 2 west; thence running in a southwesterly direction along the most practical route for about 100 rods, terminating at a stake marked "R" which is set 120 rods south and 62 rods east of the quarter stake on the north side of section 17, said Township and range, and to vacate all of that portion of the old road between the beginning and terminal points of the change as prayed for.

And it satisfactorily appearing to the Court from proof filed herein, that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required, and that twelve of said petitioners are legal freeholders of this county, residing in the road district or districts of the proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond has been given and filed herein.

It is therefore ordered by the court that the Board of County Road Viewers meet at Scappoose, Oregon on the 9th day of May, 1911, or on their failure to meet on that day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and locate said proposed road.

It appearing to the court that the Board of County Road Viewers have failed to make said re-view within the time specified in a former order of this court, and the court being advised in the matter it is ordered that the Board of County Road Viewers meet at Scappoose, Oregon on the 11th day of May, 1911 or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to survey and re-locate said road as prayed for in said petition.

Matter of Scalp Bounty Claims:
