Matter of issuing warrants for delinquency in State tax.

It appearing to the court that at the time of making the tax levy for the year 1910 the total valuation of the assessment roll, as reported by the Board of State Tax Commissioners, contained the valuation of the Portland & Southwestern Railroad Company as assessed by the County Assessor, and also the valuation placed on said property by said Board of State Tax Commissioners; That said error was not in evidence until said Board of State Tax Commissioners returned their report with an itemized statement of assessment made by them, which was subsequent to the making of said tax levy; That said double assessment was corrected by the County Clerk before extending said on the roll thereby causing a deficiency in the sum of \$206.30 each in the amount of State Tax as raised by the tax roll.

It is therefore ordered by the court that the County Clerk be and he is authorized to issue two warrants on the general fund in favor of the State Treasurer in the sum of \$103.15 each, to be applied on State Tax in two payments.

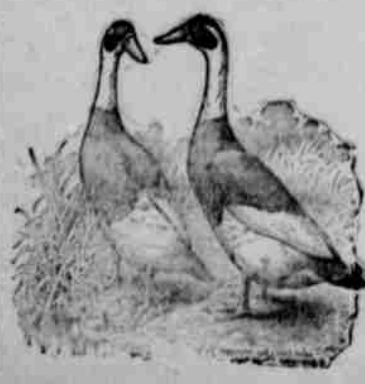
