Rainier 8: St. Helens 6

At ten thirty last Sunday the band, the ball team and a few loyal fans met at the dock ready to go to Rainier and do things to the Le Bire tribe. The third, fourth, fifth and six were passed without either side scoring, and with the board decorated 6 to 1 in favor of St. Helens the chances for getting away with the grapes looked good, but it was in the next chapters that things began to happen. With the exception of the two first innings Winterbotham certainly got away good. Wm. Reed was holding the indicator, and was on the job all the time. It has never been our good fortune to witness more fair and impartial work.

Everybody was happy, and came home voting Rainier a good town to play ball in. But then, St. Helens beat them three times last week, even if they did skin us in the game that we really wanted.
