Accident Causes Arrest

A fractured right leg, received when he fell from a load of logs at the Hammond Lumber Company's camp at Oak Point last Friday, is responsible for the arrest of George Savich, or Savage, who is accused of the theft of \$250 in cash, and four rings valued at \$175, from Jim Wallace an employe of the Eastern and Western camp at Eufaula. But for the accident, Savich would now be at large, with not the slightest suspicion against him, instead of being a county charge in a hospital at Vancouver, preparing to face a charge of theft as soon as he is recovered.

Suspicion of the theft was not directed to the injured man until last Saturday, when "Bob" McDonald of the Eastern & Western camp, in conversation with Dr. F. Bird of Kelso, discovered that \$225 in cash and the rings had been found upon the person of Savich at the time he was injured. McDonald, who knew of Wallace's loss, immediately went to the payroll ledger and discovered that Savich had had time to work just four days for the Hammond company between the time he left the E. & W. and the day of the accident. He immediately went to Kelso with Wallace, who identified the rings as his property, while Dr. Bird and Deputy Sheriff Ed Close of Cowlitz County came to the conclusion that the hospital at Kelso was not the proper place for the suspect. Savich was shipped to Vancouver Sunday afternoon.

Wallace considers himself just about the luckiest man in the logging woods of this part of the country. He missed the money and the rings on Saturday, August 5, and had given up all hope of recovering them as he knew no one to suspect. His property will be returned to him as soon as the case gets into court at the juryterm in September.

Mr. E. H. Wicks died at the hospital in Portland last Saturday and was buried at this place on Sunday. He had been sick for a long time, and was taken to the Good Samaritan Hospital last September. Mr. Wicks has been a resident of this place for several years working at his trade of blacksmithing. He was a member of the Oddfellows of this place and of the Houlton Lodge of United Artisans. He is survived by a wife and two small children.
