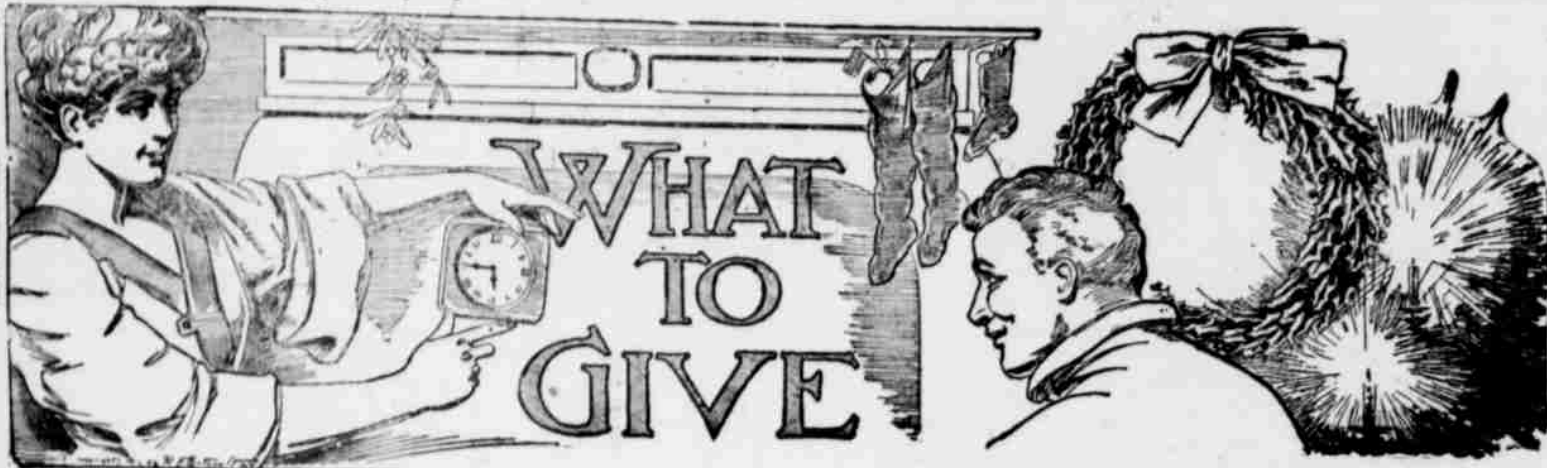

County Court Proceeding

Wednesday, Dec. 6, 1911; 3rd. Judicial Day. Court came pursuant to Adjournment. Officers all present. Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the petition and application of Columbia Agricultural Co., a corporation, for the vacation of all that portion of Bryant's 2nd. Addition to the City of Clatskanie, situated in Government lots numbered five and six in section five, T 7, N R 4 W of the Willamette meridian, in said County and State, excepting railroad avenue therein.

On this 6th day of December, 1911 this matter coming on regularly for consideration by the Court, and it appearing to the Court that said petition, together with an intelligent map or plat of the property so sought to be vacated, was filed in the office of the County Clerk, on the 24th day of October, 1911, from which it appears to the satisfaction of the Court that said portions so sought to be vacated do not lie with-

in the incorporated limits of any city or town, that it has not been improved for streets or building purposes, and that there are no persons interested therein except the petitioner herein:

And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, from affidavits on file herein, that due and legal notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given, both by publication and posting of notices, for a period of more than 30 days preceding the presentation of Petition herein;

And it further appearing to the Court that no objections have been made or filed herein, and it appearing to the Court that all the allegations of said petition are true;

It is now, therefore, hereby ordered by the Court that all that portion of Bryant's 2nd addition to the City of Clatskanie, above County and State, situated in government lots numbered five (5) and six (6) in township seven (7) north, range four (4) west of the Willamette Meridian, in Oregon, save and excepting a certain right-of-way of the Clatskanie and Nehalem railroad Company, located across said sec-

tion five (5), said township and range, extending from what is known as Beaver Slough to the right-of-way of the Astoria and Columbia River Railroad Company, said strip of right-of-way being seventy-five (75) feet in width on each side of the center line of the railroad track thereon; also save and excepting all avenues, streets and alleys therein; or thereon and also excepting all that portion of what was formerly known as Bryant's 2nd. Addition to the city of Clatskanie, situated in the E G Bryant D L C., and lying North of the right of way of the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad, which was heretofore vacated by order of this Court, be, and the same is hereby vacated. Matter of designating polling places and appointing Judges and Clerks of election:
