County Official Paper

Much discussion concerning the proposed sewer is heard in all quarters. There are those who are demanding its immediate construction according to the provisions of the charter; others are anxious for a sewer but think at the manner of assessing the cost is not equitable, while still others are opposing the sewer, principally on account of the great expense that will necessarily be incurred in its construction. That a sewer is a most urgent necessity for the welfare of the citizens will not be disputed if one will take the time to visit portions of the city where there are no sewers. There are certain lots lying along the low places which receive the refuse of the higher lots and have become a breeding place for disease. The owners of these law lots are entitled to have proper sewer connections for themselves as well as to turn the filth away from their property. As a matter of fact there are no sewers of any consequence in the residence portion of the city and with the population increasing as it has been doing the last two or three years it is only a matter of a short time until the

health authorities' will be compelled to act if the citizens do not. Sewer building in St. Helens is an expensive undertaking but the time has arrived when it is a positive necessity and the property owners and citizens should get together on a plan and hurry to completion a first class sewer system. The following election data will be of interest to the voters and candidates for office as the dates for all important acts are figured out from the direct primary law: Jan. 2, Registration books open. April 3, Registration books close for primary election. March 29, latest date on which candidates for state and district offices, Circuit Judges and District Attorneys can file petitions with Sec. of State. April 3, Latest date on which petitions for nominations for offices to be voted for in only one county, including county offices can be filed with the County Clerk. April 19, Primary Nominating Election, from 8 A. M. till 7 P. M. Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Ore., Jan. 19--The organization of the county industrial fairs and the promotion of agricultural education in Oregon will be under the control of Mr. Thomason, a member of the staff of the Oregon Agricultural College Extension Division under Prof. R. Alderman, Mr. Thomason will visit the various counties, aiding the school authorities in organizing the industrial work and promoting the school fairs and school gardens. The work

is a part of that planned by the State Bankers' Association and promoted by the Oregon Development League, the State Fair Association, the State Superintendent of Schools and the agricultural college. Since his graduation in 1907 at Whitman College, Mr. Thomason has been in journalistic work in various parts of the state, notably at LaGrande, Pendleton, Salem, and Portland, and has done much toward better farm methods and the improvement of rural conditions generally.
