### County Official Paper

Governor West has issued a proclamation calling attention to the necessity of good roads legislation and setting apart the week beginning the 4th of Feb. as "Good Roads Week" and urging citizens to carefully study the question of good roads legislation. The state wide legislative committee appointed by the Governor to formulate the proposed road laws, has prepared the bills and they are being distributed to the members. One of the bills provides for the creation of a State Highway Department, to be presided over by a State Highway Commissioner at a salary of \$5000 per year and an Assistant Highway Commissioner at a salary of \$500 per year. Any county receiving state funds for road building will have the services of the State Commissioner, and the funds from the state shall be collected partly from Auto licenses and from the sale of bonds of the State. It is proposed to issue \$20,000,000 of bonds of the State \$2,000,000 yearly for ten years, payable 30 years after date of issue and bearing interest 5 per cent per annum, which will be divided among the counties according to the area of the

such county. All these bills will be on the ballot at the election in November and in the meantime it would be well for every property owner and voter to thoroughly acquaint himself with these proposed laws so that an intelligent expression of the people may be had on the question.

E. B. Tongue, of Hillsboro, has announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for District Attorney for the district composed of Clackamas, Washington, Clatsop and Columbia Counties, to succeed himself. Mr. Tongue has held the office during the past three and a half years and has been a faithful and efficient officer. His ability as a prosecutor is recognized by every person in the district who has had the opportunity of hearing him or of having had business with him. His administration of the office has been thoroughly satisfactory to the people and the Courts. He is fearless and honest and with the ability which he possesses as a prosecutor, we doubt if there will be much opposition to him at the next primaries and election.

Calling the attention to the need for more poultry men in the Pacific Northwest, H. Beckwith, President of the Portland Commercial Club, has compiled official statistics showing that 204 carloads of eggs were shipped into Portland during 1911, from states east of the Rocky Mountains. From the same territory came 20 carloads of dressed poultry. These products, he points out, should all be grown at home.

Oregon Agricultural College—Cooperative tests in wood preservation, especially as to fence posts, are being carried on by H. B. Oakleaf of the U. S. Forest

Service office of products at Portland and the school of forestry at the Oregon Agricultural College.

In preserving fence posts, the hot and cold tank method, of forcing hot creosote for three hours into the wood, and then immersing it for the same length of time in cold creosote, is used. Both oak and fir posts were used and it has already been fairly determined that posts thus treated will outlast ordinary posts by many years.
