Thomas, Defendants, for the sum of Eighteen Hundred Twelve & 26-100 Dollars, together with interest thereon from the 9th day of January, 1912, at the rate of 6 per cent per annum until paid, and the further sum of Seventeen & 50-100 Dollars costs and of costs of and upon this writ commanding me to make sale of the following described real property, to-wit:-
