County Official Paper

One of the most interesting political scraps to be had at the publican Primaries will be the one between Ben W. Olcott and S. Fields for the nomination of Secretary of State. Mr. Olcott is the present Secretary, having been appointed by Governor Atwood upon the death of former Secretary Frank W. Benson. Mr. Fields is the present County Clerk of Multnomah County which office he has filled for the past ten years. Both of the men are well known over the state at present although Mr. Fields has only come into prominence during the past year by becoming a Republican member of State by virtue of his appointment by a Democratic Governor. As to the efficiency of Mr. Olcott to handle the affairs of the big office, there is to be no question, but the fact that he is the product of a Democratic organization and still claims to be a republican will give many good republicans to state before casting a ballot for him as a Republican; On the other hand the efficiency of Mr. Fields cannot be questioned as

his many years of service as clerk of the large county of Multnomah has especially fitted him for just such a position. Then he also has the advantage of a clean record as a Republican. Taken altogether it looks like a nice fight with the chances in favor of Mr. Fields.

Mr. W. H. Cooper, of Rainier, was attending to business in St. Helens Monday and while here gave out the information that he would be a candidate for the Republican nomination for County Judge at the coming primaries. Mr. Cooper is a native Oregonian and has practiced law for 18 years, nearly altogether in Oregon. He served four years as County Judge of Tillamook Co. and two years ago moved to Rainier where he has been practicing his profession. He has bought some property in Rainier and is a permanent resident of the county. Should he be nominated and elected to the office, the county will have a man in that position who has had experience and one whose integrity has never been questioned.
