### County Official Paper

The Oregonian has discovered that under the proposed new road laws, wherein the state will be bonded for \$20,000,000, Multnomah County will pay, including interest, to this fund the sum of \$18,270,865 and will receive from the fund for the use of the roads in that county the magnificent sum of \$920,522. Just a little difference of some \$17,000,000 which they will pay more than they will receive. We have not taken the time to figure out just how this proposed law will work in Columbia County but would urge upon every property owner to do so before casting a vote on the question. In any event it does seem that a law which will require any one county to pay \$17,000,000 more into a fund than it will receive is not a fair law and one that should be carefully avoided.

The action of the County Court appropriating \$200 for a county fair, at its meeting this week, is to be commended. It is a step in the right direction and good results are sure to follow.

With this small beginning it will be only a matter of a short time until the entire county will join in getting together on a county fair which will be a great incentive to the farmers and producers to grow and produce the very best of everything. The Yankton men who have been working on this matter for the past three years so successfully have demonstrated what can be done and it is now up to the rest of the county to assist and make this fair an annual event of interest and benefit to the entire county.

The Taft Committee of Oregon is composed of some of the best citizens of the city of Portland. Of course Portland is a part of the State but there still remains a few people and some territory outside the city of Portland, and while they are organizing a Taft committee to work for the nomination and election of President Taft it may be well to take these facts into consideration.

In a letter addressed to the country press from this committee the question is asked whether or not the paper will support Taft. In answer to this letter the Mist will say that it is for the nomination and election of Taft over all others and will do its best to put before the voters of Columbia County the reasons why this should be accomplished.
