Notice is hereby given, that under and by virtue of an execution and order of sale issued out of the above entitled Court in the above entitled cause, to me directed and dated the 19th day of January, 1912, upon a judgment, decree and order of sale, rendered and entered in said Court and cause on the 19th day of January, 1912, in favor of Merchants National Bank, a corporation, Plaintiff, and against Rainer Mine Company, a private corporation, L. S. Thomas and Florence E. Thomas, Defendants, for the sum of Eighteen Hundred Twelve & 25-100 Dollars, together with interest thereon from the 9th day of January, 1912, at the rate of 6 per cent per annum until paid, and the further sum of Seventeen & 50-100 Dollars costs and of costs of and upon this writ commanding me to make sale of the following described real property, to-wit:

Notice Closing Streams
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS—That, WHEREAS, for the purpose of propagating, stocking and protecting the salmon fish which frequent the waters of the Clatskanie River and its tributaries, in the State of Oregon, the State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners has decided to close said Clatskanie River and its tributaries to prevent fishing therein by any means whatever, except with hook and line commonly called angling, for salmon fish during the period of time hereinafter specified.

Now THEREFORE, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, by said State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners that said Clatskanie River and its tributaries are, and each of them is hereby closed to fishing of any kind for salmon fish, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, from March 1, 1912, until said streams are opened in accordance with Section 5316 of Lord's Oregon Laws; and it is and will be unlawful to fish for or take or catch any salmon by any means whatever, except with hook and line, commonly called angling during the same period of time above specified.

Any and all persons whomsoever so fishing in violation of this notice will be prosecuted, as by law provided.
