## County Official Paper

The political situation in Col-  
umbia County is beginning to  
heat up. Candidates for nearly  
all offices to be filled are get-  
ting off the fence and coming out  
into the open. Several have al-  
ready filed with the Clerk and  
others have made known their  
intentions of doing so at an  
early date. For County Judge,  
W. H. Cooper of Rainier has  
already filed and others promi-  
sely mentioned on the Republi-  
can side are Judson Weed of  
Rainier and W. A. Harris of St.  
Helens. On the Democratic side  
of Judge Dart and W. J.  
Thompson. For Clerk, H. E. La-  
son has filed and as yet there  
has been no one, either Republi-  
can or Democrat, who cares to dis-  
pute his claim of re-election. For  
County Assessor, N. Kinney of St. Helens  
has filed his declaration and has  
been in circulation for the  
Republican nomination and we  
hear of E. C. Stanwood of War-  
renton and W. E. Conyers of Clats-  
kanie. On the Democratic side  
Thompson has made  
his intentions of seeking  
re-election and will probably  
do so with the nomination.

For Assessor, C. W. Blakesley  
has been "mentioned" as a prob-  
able Republican aspirant and U.  
W. Clark will undoubtedly be the  
Democratic nominee. For Treas-  
urer, A. T. Laws will no doubt  
seek re-election as a Republican  
and probably R. S. Hattan will  
be the Democratic aspirant. For  
Coroner, Frank Sherwood  
will ask for the nomination again  
as a Republican and T. S. White  
of Houlton will likely be his op-  
ponent. For school Superintendent,  
no name has been mentioned  
except the present incumbent,  
J. H. Collins and he is apt to get  
the office again by default. For  
Representative, there are several  
names mentioned among them  
being Norman Merrill of Clats-  
kanie, A. L. Clark of Rainier, T.  
C. Watts of Reuben and M. E.  
Miller of St. Helens. No filings  
for this office have been made  
but no doubt will be within a  
short time.

With the exception of those  
who have already filed these  
names mentioned are only rum-  
ors and none of them have  
made any announcements but they  
are so persistently rumored that  
no doubt most of them will be  
candidates. Of course there will  
be others too for most of the of-  
fices, as it is quite a while until  
April 3rd.

WHEREAS, said streams are fre-  
quented by salmon fish, and for the  
purpose of protecting the same,  
the said State Board of Fish and  
Game Commissioners has decided  
to close the said Willamette river,  
and its tributaries, below and north  
of the falls thereof, at Oregon City,  
and all of the Clackamas river, and  
its tributaries, to prevent fishing  
therein, by any means whatever,  
except with hook and line, commonly  
called angling, for salmon fish,  
during the period of time hereinaf-  
ter specified.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE IS  
HEREBY GIVEN by said State Board  
of Fish and Game Commissioners  
that said Willamette river, and its  
tributaries, below and north of the  
falls thereof, at Oregon City, and  
all of said Clackamas river, and its  
tributaries, are and each of them  
is hereby closed to fishing, by any  
means whatever, except with hook  
and line, commonly called angling,  
for salmon fish between twelve  
o'clock noon, on the 1st day of  
March, 1912, and twelve o'clock  
noon on the 1st day of May, 1912;  
and it is and will be unlawful to  
fish for, or take, or catch any sal-  
mon fish by any means whatever,  
except with hook and line, com-  
monly called angling in any of said  
waters during the said period of  
time above specified.

Any and all persons whomsoever  
so fishing in violation of this notice  
will be prosecuted as by law pro-  
vided.
