### ORDINANCE NO—

An ordinance requiring all houses  
within certain distances of a con-  
structed sewer within the City of  
St. Helens, to connect with same;  
providing notice to the owner or  
agent of such property, fixing a  
penalty for a violation thereof, and  
providing a method of enforcing  
such connection, and declaring an  
emergency.

The City of St. Helens does or-  
dain as follows:

Sec. 1-The owner or agent of any  
house or building on any lot or lots  
located within a sewer district and  
not more than 160 feet of any sewer  
already constructed, shall, at his own  
expense connect the said house or  
houses with such sewer upon notice  
given by the Council as in this or-  
dinance provided.

Sec. 2-Whenever it shall become  
known to the Council, either upon  
notification of any private citizen or  
through public notoriety, that any  
building or buildings within such  
distance from any sewer is not con-  
nected and that any filth or dirt is  
accumulating on any yard, premises  
or street from any such premises,  
the Council may, by motion or res-  
olution, instruct the City Recorder,  
under the seal of the City, to notify  
the owner, agent or person in charge  
of any such premises, to make con-  
nections with any such sewer within  
a certain number of days, not less  
than 10, which said notice shall be  
served by the Marshal and a copy  
thereof with a certificate of such  
service thereon, filed in the office of  
the Recorder.

Sec. 3-If any person or persons,  
owning or acting as agent for the  
owners, fail or neglect to make  
such connections within the time  
specified in said notice, after due  
service thereof, and as a result  
thereof any filth or refuse matter  
shall accumulate in or upon said  
premises or on any street abutting  
thereon, such person or persons,  
either the owner or agent, shall be  
subject to arrest and upon convic-  
tion thereof before the Recorder  
shall be deemed guilty of a misde-  
meanor and shall be fined in any  
sum not less than \$1.00 nor more  
than \$50.00.

Sec. 4- In addition to the penalty  
prescribed in Section 3 of this or-  
dinance, or in lieu thereof, if the  
person or persons, either as owner or  
agent of the owner of such premises  
fail to make the connections as pre-  
scribed in Section 1 hereof within  
the time specified in the notice as  
prescribed in Sec 2, the Council  
may order the Marshal or other of-  
ficer or committee of the council to  
cause the same to be done and for  
the purposes of carrying this into  
effect any such Marshal or officer or  
committee of the council or those  
working under them, shall be and  
are hereby authorized to enter up-  
on any premises and make any nec-  
essary cuts, ditches or other works  
to make such connections without  
being deemed guilty of trespass,  
and when any such connections are  
made under the direction of the  
council an itemized bill of the ex-  
penses of such work and material  
used in the making of such con-  
nections shall be filed with the Rec-  
order and by him placed in the  
docket of city liens as a charge  
against the property and if not so  
paid shall be collected as other street  
and sewer improvements are col-  
lected in the city.

Sec. 5-Inasmuch as there are sev-

eral locations in the City where  
filth and disease breeding germs are  
accumulating which could be avoided  
by proper sewer connections and the  
public health is endangered thereby,  
it is hereby declared that for the  
protection of the public peace health  
and safety it is necessary that this  
ordinance shall become effective at  
once, an emergency is hereby de-  
clared to exist and this ordinance  
shall be exempted from the provi-  
sions of the referendum and shall  
be in full force and effect from and  
after its passage by the council and  
approval by the mayor.

Approved, Feb. 20, 1912, A. B.  
Lake, acting Mayor.
