County Official Paper

To the great body of Republicans who are sincere in their belief that this party is the advance agent of prosperity and that a continuance of the party in power is necessary for the continued prosperity of the country, the entrance of Roosevelt into the race for President will not be received with the enthusiasm that he and his backers will suppose. It will mean that the chasm between the so called Regulars and the Insurgents will grow wider and instead of harmony in the party there will prevail the wildest disorder and discord. Such discord in all probability as will mean the retirement of the Republican party from power. With all due respect for the great ability and statesmanship of Theodore Roosevelt, it looks, at this distance, to be a sad mistake for him to enter the race at this time for the re-nomination.
