Notice Closing Streams. Know All Men By These Presents-That, WHEREAS, for the purpose of propagating, stocking and protecting the salmon fish which frequent the waters of the Clatskanie River and its tributaries, in the State of Oregon, the State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners has decided to close said Clatskanie River and its tributaries to prevent fishing therein by any means whatever, except with hook and line commonly called angling, for salmon fish during the period of time hereinafter specified.

NOW THEREFORE, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, by said State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners that said Clatskanie River and its tributaries are, and each of them is hereby closed to fishing of any kind for salmon fish, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, from March 1, 1912, until said streams are opened in accordance with Section 5316 of Lord's Oregon Laws; and it is and will be unlawful to fish for or take or catch any salmon by any means whatever, except with hook and line, commonly called angling during the same period of time above specified.
