County Court Proceedings

Matter of purchase of Rock Crusher;

On this day a contract is entered into with the Buffalo Steam Roller Co., for the purchase of one Reliance Rock Crusher, for the sum of \$1520., to be paid for from the special tax funds of Road District No. 11, said crusher to be used by said Road District No. 11.

Matter of purchase of Traction Engines;

On this day a contract is entered into with A H Averill Machinery Co., for the purchase of two Simple Russel Traction Engines one 15 HP for the sum of \$1534 and one 18 HP for the sum of \$1644.

Matter of purchase of Auto Tractor;

On this day a contract is entered into with Beall & Co., for the purchase, on trial of one 45 H P Auto Tractor with 2 yd trail wagon.

On this day the clerk presents to the court the verified claims of Fred Floeter for \$22.00 for one Cougar and six wild cats, and G C Mellinger for \$10.00 for five wild cats being claims numbered 28 and 29, and the court being advised in the matter it is ordered by the court that said claims be and they are hereby approved.

Matter of special road meeting in Road District No 10;

On this day comes on for consideration the resolution adopted by the taxpayers of road district No. 10 providing for changing the place expending a portion of the special tax fund of said road district and the court being advised in the matter it is ordered by the court that said resolution be and the same is hereby approved.

Matter of petition of James Leonard Adm'r for tax rebate;

On this day comes on for hearing the petition of James Leonard as administrator of the estate of Martin Carniff, deceased, praying for a rebate of tax for year 1909 in the sum of \$34.13 and for year 1910 in the sum of \$38.46 for alleged excessive valuation of timber on NW 1-4 sec 34, 4-2.

And the court being advised in the premises it is ordered by the court that said petition be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of Petition of S. Rock, et al for a county road.

On this 3rd day of January, 1912 comes on for hearing the petition of S. Rock, et al freeholders residing in the road district or districts of the said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road, described as follows:

Beginning at a stake marked "A" 35 rods east of the quarter section corner on the north line of section 2 Township 4 north range 2 west of the Willamette Meridian in said county and state, and running thence in a northwesterly direction to and terminating at a stake marked "B" set in the center of the county road, fifteen north of the northwest corner of section 2, T 4 N R 2 W;

And it satisfactorily appearing to the court from proof filed herein, that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required, that twelve of said petitioners are legal freeholders of this county, residing in the road district or districts of the proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond has been given and filed herein.

It is therefore ordered by the court that the Board of County Road Viewers meet at the beginning point of said proposed road on the 4th day of April, 1912, or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and locate said proposed road.

Matter of Petition of J B Duncan, et al For a county road.

On this 7th day of March, 1912, comes on for hearing the petition of J. B. Duncan, et al. freeholders, residing in the road district or districts of said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a County road, described as follows:

Beginning at a stake marked "A" set in the Western margin of the Portland and St Helens county road, at a point twenty feet southerly from the southeast corner of the tract of land owned by School District Number One Jt. of Columbia and Multnomah counties, Oregon, in Section 12, T 3, N R 2 W of W M and from thence running westerly, parallel with the south boundary of said school district tract, a distance of 460 feet; from thence on the same course a distance of 500 feet, more or less, to a stake marked "B" and from thence in a southwesterly direction a distance of 90 feet more or less, to a point 22.46 feet northerly from the northwest corner of the Jesse Miles D L C, thence south 52 deg 32 min W 424, thence south West 341.90 feet; thence south 19 deg 04 min W 303.
