## County Official Paper

Friday April 19, 1912, the people of the State of Oregon will have the first chance to vote for candidates for President of the United States. Three names will be on each of the Republican and Democratic ballots, the Republicans being Robert M. LaFollete, Theodore Roosevelt and Wm. H. Taft. All three are men of national wide and world wide fame; Mr. LaFollete as a leader of the Insurgent movement, Mr. Roosevelt as ex-President and Mr. Taft as the present efficient head of this great nation. It is generally conceded that Mr. LaFollete does not stand much chance, unless it be on a compromise, so the real battle is between Roosevelt and Taft. Mr. Roosevelt has already served two terms as President and is now going to try the experiment of asking for a third term, breaking all precedent, while Mr. Taft is only asking for a second term, which any man who has made good is entitled to.

On the Democratic side Woodrow Wilson, Governor of New Jersey is the leading candidate although Governor Harmon of Ohio and Speaker Champ Clark of Missouri have each a large following.

One of the Judges on the City Election Board has suggested an election, or rather ballot, reform which is worthy of consideration. There were several ballots cast at the election which contained the names of Ah Pon, Won Lung etc for various offices, which apparently were not being contested for by people who suited the voter. When there is an attempt to show wit in such manner by the voter and a contempt for the candidate by writing in some Chinese name rather than by leaving the ballot blank or voting for some responsible citizen, the ballot should be cast aside and the entire vote lost to the witty elector.

Matter of construction of steel bridge across the Clatskanie river in the city of Clatskanie. On this day this matter coming on for consideration, and it appearing to the court that the present bridge structure across the Clatskanie river in the City of Clatskanie, is unsafe for public travel and it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety that a new bridge be constructed.

It is therefore ordered by the court that an emergency exists and it is necessary for the preservation of the public safety that said bridge be constructed.

It is further ordered by the court that the court procure the necessary material for said bridge, and that W. F. Haldeman be, and he is hereby employed as superintendent of said bridge construction, with authority to purchase necessary material for same, for and in the name of said county; that the provisions of the law in reference to advertisement for bids be waived and that construction begin immediately, under the supervision of the County Court.

It is further ordered by the court that the sum of \$3950.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary for the construction of said bridge, including material, freight and labor charges, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the General Road Fund to defray said expense.

Whereupon, Court adjourned.
