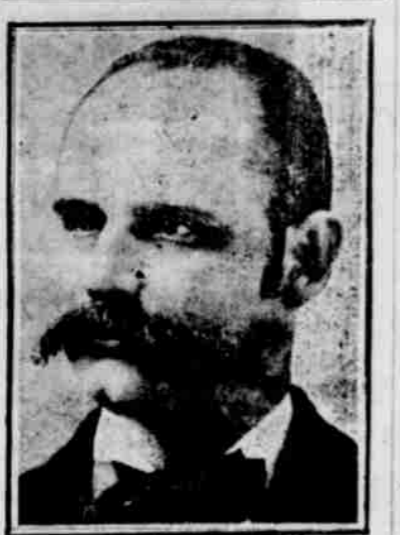

Ben Selling Wins Republican Nomination for United States Senator. Portland.—Under the first presidential preference primaries held in Oregon Roosevelt was the choice of the Republican voters.

Governor Woodrow Wilson, of New Jersey, was the choice of the Democratic voters for president, though Speaker Champ Clark received a substantial vote in many counties.

Ben Selling was successful in winning the Republican nomination for United States senator over Senator Jonathan Bourne, the present incumbent.
