The following clippings taken from a paper published in Nebraska and show the kind of weather they are having there now:

Eighteen were injured, one seriously, when a Union Pacific train was blown from the track three miles north of North Loup Thursday evening. That the injuries were not more serious is attributed by the passengers to the presence of mind of the engineer, Joe O'Brien, who brought his train to a full stop before the cars were lifted from the rails by the tornado.

The storm was accompanied by immense hail stones which broke all of the car windows on the north side before they were blown from the track.

"A tornado yesterday completely wrecked the Algernon school near here, and carried the building containing 12 pupils and the teacher in a distance of nearly 1500 feet. Miss Clara Mills, the teacher, was seriously cut about the head and will probably lose the sight of one eye."
