County Court Proceedings

Matter of Transfer of Funds: On this day it is ordered by the court that the Treasurer be, and he is hereby instructed to transfer the sum of \$460.00 from the Special Road Fund of Road District No. 8, to the General Road Fund. It is further ordered by the court that the clerk be and he is hereby instructed and directed to credit said sum of \$460.00 to the District Fund of said Road District No. 8, all on account of Special Road Contract of E. J. Lindberg having been paid from the District Fund of said District.

Matter of Resignation of Road Viewer: On this day H. T. Bennett tenders to the court his written resignation as County Road Viewer, and the court being advised it is ordered by the court that said resignation be and the same is hereby accepted.

Matter of Appointment of County Road Viewer: On this day it is ordered by the court that H. J. Southard be, and he is hereby appointed County Road Viewer.

Whereupon, court adjourned until Friday May 3, 1912.

Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had:

Matter of Petition of J. B. Duncan, et al. For county road. On this day comes on for hearing the petition of J. B. Duncan, et al., for a county road, upon the second reading of the report of the Board of County Road Viewers, which said report was publicly read on two different days of this term of court, and it appearing to the court that said report of the Viewers is favorable thereto, and that said Viewers assess damages to J. Eagleston in the sum of \$250.00.

And it further appearing to the Court that such road would be of public utility, it is ordered by the Court that said road be allowed, and that damages be allowed J. Eagleston in the sum of \$250.00 as reported by the Viewers, all on condition that petitioners settle with said J. Eagleston on or before June 5, 1912, for amounts claimed in excess of said \$250.00.

It is further ordered by the Court that in the event such settlement be made, as aforesaid, such report, survey, profile and plat be recorded in suitable books kept for that purpose, and from thenceforth said road shall be a public highway.
