County Court Proceedings

Wednesday, June 5, 1912. 4th Judicial Day Court came pursuant to Adjournment. Officers all present. Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had:

Matter of Issuing Warrant to W. F. Halderman.

On this day it is ordered by the Court that the Clerk be, and he is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a General Road Fund Warrant in the sum of \$1000.00, in favor of W. H. Halderman, to be used in payment of certain claims against the construction of Steel Bridge at Clatskanie.

Matter of Claim of G. W. Rhodes. On this day the claim of G. W. Rhodes for damages in the sum of \$75.00 on account of one certain cow being killed by falling into the County Gravel Pit at Scappoose, coming on for consideration, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that said claim be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of Petition of A. S. Graham for refund of Pen. & Int. On this 5th day of June, 1912, comes on for consideration by the court, the petition of A. S. Graham for refund of penalty and interest charged against Lots 1, 2 and 3, in Sec. 30, 8-4, on account of delinquent tax for years 1910 and 1911, and the court being advised in the premises, it is ordered by the court that said petition be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of Bids for Special Road Work in R. D. No. 6. This matter having been heretofore continued to this date, and it appearing to the court that there are no bids on file for the performance of such special improvements as heretofore advertised, it is ordered by the court that said work be performed by the Supervisor of said Road District No. 6, under the direction of the county court.

Matter of Special Road Meeting held in Road District No. 6. On this day it is ordered by the court that the Resolution for changing the

expenditure of special Road Tax Funds in Road Dist. No. 6, be and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of Petition of J. B. Duncan, et. al. for County Road. The above entitled Road Petition having been heretofore allowed condition that said petitioners settle claims for damages in excess of the sum of \$250.00, now on this day it appearing to the court that such claims have not been settled, it is therefore ordered by the court that said petition be, and the same is hereby denied.

Matter of Deed for Right of Way. On this day it is ordered by the court that that certain deed of conveyance from John M. Millis and Anna L. Millis to Columbia County, dated May 24, 1912, conveying a strip of land for road purposes, be and the same is hereby approved.
