Ordinance No. 124

An Ordinance regulating the speed of automobiles, motor vehicles, motorcycles and other vehicles, the motive power of which is generated by steam, electricity, gasoline or other petroleum

product, within the City of St. Helens, Oregon, declaring the violation thereof a misdemeanor; and providing a penalty therefor.
The City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:
Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to drive or operate any automobile, motor vehicle, motorcycle or other vehicle, the motive power of which is generated by steam, electricity, gas or other petroleum products upon any of the streets or roads within the corporate limits of St. Helens, Oregon, at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour, east of Bond Street, and at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour, west of said Bond Street;
Section 2. Any, and every person willfully violating any of the provisions of section 1, of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$20.00, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than two days and not more than ten days.
