**County Court
Proceedings**

Matter of Transfer of Funds: On
this day it is ordered by the Court
that the Treasurer be, and he is
hereby instructed to transfer the
sum of \$25.00 from the General
Road Fund to the Special Road Fund
of Road Dist. No. 10, on account of
rock furnished for construction of
Steel Bridge.

It is further ordered that the sum
of \$16.00 of this amount be deducted
from the claim of W. F. Halder-
man for balance due him on account
of said bridge construction.

Whereupon, Court adjourned un-
til Saturday, July 6, 1912.
Saturday, July 6, 1912, 3rd Judi-
cial day, Court came pursuant to ad-
journment. Officers all present.
Due proclamation being made, the
following proceedings were had:

**Matter of petition of Walter Hun-
ter for Liquor License for Goble
Precinct.** On this 6th day of July,
1912, comes on for hearing the peti-
tion of Walter Hunter, for a license
to sell spiritous, vinous and malt
liquors and fermented cider, in less
quantities than one gallon, in Goble
precinct for the period of six months.

And it satisfactorily appearing to
the Court from proofs filed herein,
that due notice of the pendency of
this proceeding has been given as by
law required; that petitioner has not
been convicted of wilfully selling or
delivering spiritous, vinous, ferment-
ed or malt liquors to a minor, or of
wilfully allowing a minor to loiter
in or about any place where such
liquors are sold or disposed of; and
it further appearing to the Court
that said petition contains the sig-
natures of a majority of all the legal
voters of said precinct who are actual
residents thereof, and who have
actually resided therein at least 30
days immediately preceding the
signing and presentation of said
petition.

And the said petitioner having filed
with the Clerk of this Court a
bond duly approved by the County
Judge, and also having filed a dupli-
cate receipt of the County Treasur-
er in the sum of Two Hundred Dol-
lars, and the Court being advised in
the premises, it is ordered by the
Court that said petition be granted
and that license issue to the
said Walter Hunter, to sell spiritous,

vinous and malt liquors and ferment-
ed cider in less quantities than one
gallon, in Goble precinct, for the
period of six months from July 7,
1912.

that the Treasurer be, and he is
hereby authorized and instructed to
transfer the following named

Road fund, on account of powder
furnished said road districts, hereto-
