An Ordinance declaring the intention of the City Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, to establish a sewerage system within Sewer District No. 2 of said City, showing the location of the same; the material out of which same shall be constructed; appointing appraisers and arbitrators to appraise probable costs; providing for notice to property owners; and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith and declaring an emergency.
