WHAT PRESIDENT TAFT HAS DONE

Some of the Legislation Accomplished During His Administration. There has been a systematic attempt for years on the part of newspaper and magazine writers in the pay of the great magazine trust to belittle and misrepresent President Taft.

For the benefit of our readers and in justice to the president, this paper sets out below some of the many things he has accomplished:

- He put the postoffice department on a paying basis for the first time within the memory of the present generation. He increased the salaries of the postmaster general without fear or favor. He vetoed the Democratic wool, cotton and flax tariff bill, an unduly protective and destructive of the Republican principle of protection. He has effected the discriminating passport treaty with Russia. He prevented railroads from putting rates on freight and mail without approval of the Interstate Commerce Commission. He has signed the bill for admission of Arizona and New Mexico to statehood. He has established the Bureau of Mines to safeguard the lives of miners. He has extended the civil service in all departments of the federal government by executive order. He has secured practical conservation acts. He has established a Court of Customs Appeals, by which undervalued goods have been stopped. He succeeded in securing a postal savings bank system that is dragging millions out of old socks and putting it to work. He favored Barak's 3-year home-stead bill. He has exhibited the highest order of statesmanship in handling the delicate and provoking Mexican situation, and preventing the United States out of an expensive and bloody war, while at the same time maintaining the dignity of our nation.
