Judicial Day: Court came pursuant
to Adjournment: Officers all present:
Due Proclamation being made,
the following proceedings were had:

Matter of Scalp Bounty Claims:
On this day the Clerk presents to
the Court the verified claims of
Fred Floeter, being Claim No. 44
for \$10.00 for one Cougar, and one
wild cat, and the Court being ad-
vised in the matter, it is ordered by
the Court that said claims be, and
they are hereby approved.

**Matter of Petition of S. Rock, et
al. For a County Road:** On this
day comes on for consideration by
the Court, the claim of Rumely
Products Co., for damages in the
sum of \$350.00, claimed to be suf-
fered by them, in case of the estab-
lishment of said road. And it ap-
pearing to the Court that said Peti-
tion filed in the Court on the 4th
day of March, 1912, has heretofore
been continued on account of the
failure of the Board of County Road
Viewers to view, survey and locate
said proposed road in accordance
with the order made therefor, and
the Court being advised in the mat-
ter, it is ordered by the Court that
said Claim for damages be, and the
same is hereby denied. It is further
ordered by the Court that said
Road Petition be, and the same is
hereby denied.

**Matter of Payment to James Em-
mons for Change of Road:** On this
day it is ordered by the Court that
the Clerk be and he is hereby autho-
rized and instructed to issue a
Warrant on the Special Road Fund
of Road District No. 14, in the sum

which precinct is bounded as fol-
lows, to-wit:—Commencing at a
point in the Section line between
Sections 27 and 34, Township 4
North Range 1 West, in the center
of the Willamette Slough, thence W.
on the Section lines to the N. E.
corner of the R. S. Fullerton D. L.
C.; thence S. on the E. line of said
D. L. C. to the S. E. corner of said
Claim; thence Southwest on the W.
line of the Clouinger D. L. C. to
the Section line between Sections
25 and 36 T. 4 N. R. 2 West; thence
W. to the N. W. corner of Sec. 31,
T. 4 N. R. 3 W.; thence S. 1 mile;
thence E. 4 miles; thence S. 2 miles;
thence E. 2 miles, thence S. 1 mile;
thence E. 3 miles; thence S. 1 mile;
thence E. 6 miles; thence 2 miles;
thence W. to the center of the Willa-
mette Slough; thence down said
