PROCLAMATION STATE OF OREGON

Executive Department, Salem, Ore., Nov. 7, 1912.

WHEREAS, The growth and prosperity of a state depend to a great extent upon its manufacturing industries for the reason that the factory converts the raw material of the forest and stream and farm and mine into products of higher value, giving employment to thousands who would otherwise have no means of livelihood.

THEREFORE, In view of the foregoing premises, I, Oswald West, Governor, by virtue of the authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November twenty-first, nineteen hundred and twelve,
