FARM AND ROAD IMPROVEMENT

SAWDUST ROADS IN FLORIDA
Disposition Made of By-Products of Lumbering in Southern States—Wear Well in Georgia.

Sawdust roads are being made in an experimental way in Leon county, Florida. Great piles of sawdust dot the state throughout its pine land sections, useless monuments to the sawmill's work.

In many of the more favored sections of Florida clay lies beneath the sandy loam which is more or less over-burden. Where this over-burden is light it may be readily stripped off and a clay pit opened which affords good material for hardening the road surface.

Some sawdust roads were built in south Georgia twenty years ago and have worn well and given good satisfaction. The Leon county soil is somewhat clayed, which adapts it well to the use of sawdust, but this null by-product can also be used to advantage in the sandier soils.

The Luscious Delaware Grape. Just where the Delaware originated is not known. It was first noticed many years ago in the garden of Paul H. Provost of Hunterdon county, New Jersey. The Delaware flourishes best in a rich, well-drained soil. It is very popular in New York and other states to the south. Of high productivity and with a delicate, pleasing flavor, the Delaware holds high rank with many growers.

Listing Corn.
At one time listing corn was apt to be a rather slovenly operation, but now tools have been thoroughly well adapted to this method. Disk cultivators seem more in favor for they thoroughly destroy the weeds and then harrowing helps level the rows before the next cultivation. Even the small cane is deeply planted and seems to succeed well in states where there is plenty of rainfall.

Cooley on Good Roads.
"Road building is a science," said G. L. Cooley, representing the good roads department of the federal government at the good roads convention at the Dallas (Tex.) fair. "There is no more reason why a man should work out his road tax than that he should teach out his school tax. We lose millions of dollars annually by lack of intelligent application of road funds."

Keep Grit and Lime.
It is well to keep grit and lime within reach of the fowls at all times. It is true that in the country fowls can gather plenty of grit from the fields, but it is convenient to have it in the poultry-house, so that when bad weather is on the fowls are not compelled to be without it.

Good Roads.
Good roads are costly while they are in process of building. But we have yet to find a community which has these better highways that would by any manner of means consent to go back to the old way.

Propagating the Quince.
The quince is easily propagated from cuttings, and the orange quince is one of the best, ripens early and is of the best quality. Cuttings should be kept in moist sand in a cool cellar or buried in the grounds until wanted.

System is Lacking.
The road improvement that will be made in the United States this year, would easily be more effective if a little better system were followed. Much so-called improvement comes a long way from improving.

the stakes shall fit properly. The hole to receive the forward end of the chain should be bored at the same time.

GOOD ROAD DRAGGING

A great many experiments have been made with a great variety of devices for road dragging, but the two-slab log or plank drag with liberal "set back" has been found the most satisfactory. Double drags for working both sides of the roadway simultaneously have been tried with only limited success.

CONSTRUCTION OF GOOD ROAD

One point is generally overlooked in all our fuss about good roads, and that is the size of the job. Advocates of big bond issues talk as if fifty million dollars would give a state like Pennsylvania or Ohio good roads, whereas it will do nothing of the sort.

When we get these facts firmly in mind we shall not devote less attention to road construction but more to road improvement. We shall insist that more money be provided for the great body of road mileage, that it shall be applied in a more rational way, and then we shall have good earth roads. Just now in the clamor for road-building the dirt road has too few friends, too little money, too little study as to methods of improvement and entirely too little attention to its upkeep.

Good Roads.
New Jersey was the pioneer in the good roads movement, but New York has 80,000 miles of road with a greater mileage of improved highways than all the other eastern states put together. New York will this year spend \$21,000,000 on roads.

New Road Surface.
In Montana road experts have found that crude sugar beet syrup sprinkled over dirt roads that were dusty makes the surface impervious to rain and two coats a year will keep the road in first class condition and at very low cost.

Good Time to Think.
At this season, while you are hauling the crop to market, is a good time for you to reflect on the advantages of good roads, and how much time and money are lost by poor ones.

Country Road System.
Thirty-three counties in Michigan have adopted the county road system and about \$1,000,000 will be spent in improvements. The plan is to improve county trunk line roads at the expense of the entire county.
